




HUMANITARIAN FIELD TRAINING (HFT)

Virginia, USA

When disasters strike or communities face the effects of conflict situations, individuals with the know-how and experience to make a difference on the front lines are called upon to serve those in need. To effectively meet the challenges of working in difficult field situations and make a positive impact on lives affected, humanitarian aid workers must be fully prepared and rigorously trained on the practical skills of emergency management. Gain the knowledge, hands-on experience, and tools necessary to become a confident and successful aid worker with the Global Emergency Group (GEG) Humanitarian Field Training (HFT) course.

COURSE OVERVIEW:

- Course is run by internationally recognized emergency management professionals who have led humanitarian response efforts around the globe following natural disasters and conflict situations
- Dynamic, interdisciplinary course places emphasis on essential practical skills development.
- Provides participants the tools, understanding, confidence and skills required to 'hit the ground running' and work successfully in response to a disaster or conflict situation.
- Provides participants with hands-on exercises, simulations and discussions to address personal security and safety while working in the field
- Augments and reinforces any previous academic and theoretical training preparing participants to work with a wide range of humanitarian organizations including United Nations humanitarian agencies (e.g. UNICEF, OCHA, UNHCR and the World Food Programme), the Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement (ICRC, IFRC and National Societies), International Non Governmental Organizations (e.g. Save the Children, CARE, Oxfam), government humanitarian response entities (e.g. USAID/OFDA, DfID, ECHO), faith based response organizations, private sector response orientated companies and other humanitarian actors.
- Intended for individuals who wish to qualify for work on humanitarian field operations or who want to gain greater insight into international humanitarian response operations from a field-level perspective



METHODOLOGY:

- 4-day HFT course uses a mixed-methods approach of hands-on field practice and classroom instruction for optimal learning.
- Will use a combination of camping/tents and hotel accommodation
- Approximately 25% of the training is classroom-based with the remaining time spent engaged in field-based simulations and field exercises designed to build practical knowledge, confidence and skills.

- Humanitarian Architecture, Humanitarian Actors and the Humanitarian Community
- Humanitarian Service Sectors (Damage & Needs Assessments, Logistics, Relief, WASH, Health, Livelihoods etc.), Best Practices and Coordination
- Personal Preparedness, Security and Safety in the Field (Including Emergency First Aid, Personal Health and Safety, Dangerous Situations and Materials Awareness, Hostage Situations)
- Managing Field Equipment (Including temporary Operations and Accommodation Set-Up, Off-Road Driving, Radio Communications, GPS, Satellite Phones)
- Off Road Driving
- Cultural awareness and community engagement
